Research @ Sankara – Converge, Co-create, Collaborate.

Sankara Academy of Vision welcomed Dr. T R Raju as Research Director in May 2022 who has a vision for research at Sankara. He drives the team from writing a proposal to emerging with state of the art technology in Ophthalmology and Optometry. In 2022-2023, Sankara Research focused on projects such as Ai based diabetic retinopathy screening, genetic studies, biomarkers for eye disease, interdisciplinary research program with Yoga, diagnostic equipment development, testing the innovations in ophthalmic diagnosis and surgery, developing smart phone based diagnostic equipment. Sankara Academy of Vision released 3rd volume of "Book of Brilliant Ideas" through which we document and recognize our determined researchers for the year. Sankara Evenovate 2022 is the innovation workshop run by Sankara Academy of Vision which helped in identifying our budding researchers work and check for the possibility of patency through our legal partner. Our Sankara College of Optometry, Bangalore students have presented their innovational ideas through Sankara Eyenovate 2022, some of which include: Hand held slit lamp -To examine eye at remote locations with this portable slit lamp; ISAT - Intelligent Situation Awareness Technology which helps the person with visual impairment to identify obstacles/people; Sankara Current Recognition Software - helps the person with visual impairment with identifying authentic currency; Glare tester

and potential acuity meter – measures glare induced visual acuity through software; Dynamic Visual Acuity Chart – ability to resolve or recognize the moving objects or targets, which determines performance of a person in a wide range of real world task such as driving, sports activities are the projects among others.

2023 is the year of importance for Sankara Academy of Vision initiated the process for establishing research centre in collaboration with Manipal Academy of Higher Education (MAHE). Through research centre SAV plans to help faculty and students enroll for the PhD program and conduct research work in the disciplines of Allied health sciences, nursing, biomedical engineering, psychology and management.

Collaborations with Institutes of eminence and Industry partners

In this year, Sankara Academy of Vision collaborated various institutes of eminence for research and academics. Few of the collaborators are Indian Institute of Science, Bengaluru; Swami Vivekananda Yoga Anusandhana Samsthana University (S-VYASA, deemed university); National Centre for Biological Sciences; Manipal Academy of Higher Education; University of Bonn. The collaborations are majorly research oriented and facilitate a grander scope.

PG Update-Revise, Rewind, Refresh

PG update is a structed workshop aimed at post graduate students in Ophthalmology across India. The workshop is an amalgamation of didactic lectures, case presentations, hands on sessions, image reading, refresher on surgical

instrumentation with hand out material given to all the delegates in the workshop. The three day session was organized at Sankara Eye Hospital, Bangalore received a participation of post graduate students with 25 speakers from various ophthalmological/optometry institutes. The session also had mock examination for the exam going students and a broad discussion for them to clarify their doubts amongst the esteemed faculty from various institutes. The participants were awarded certification by Sankara Academy of Vision in collaboration with Karnataka Ophthalmic Society and Bangalore Ophthalmic Society.



Creative Workshop – Power of Collective

"Power of Collective" is a peer driven knowledge session for ophthalmologists. This session was organized by Sankara Academy of Vision and Centre of Excellence – Vitreo Retina & Orbital Oncology Department, Sankara Eye Hospital, Bangalore. The workshop was an interactive case discussion where ophthalmologists of various institutes and private practitioners would present their most challenging case and discuss to come up with possible solutions for a case. This session with very limited seats had 55 participants from across India for a 2 day workshop conducted at Sankara Academy of Vision, Sankara Eye Hospital, Bangalore.



Practice Management CME:

Practice Management CME was aimed at Sankara Eye Foundation Fellow Doctors who will be graduating and practicing ophthalmology soon after. This session, limited to Sankara Eye Foundation was focusing on art of communication, financial management, statutory and layout requirements for ophthalmology set up, instrumentation, networking, OT commissioning, SWOT analysis and discussion. This comprehensive training helped the budding ophthalmologists to build their dream of private set up. This was a one day session organized by Sankara Academy of Vision.

Culture of Quality through SanQALP : Putting patients first

SanQALP has always been on the forefront towards ensuring high quality services across our hospitals. This year there has been a focus on our unwavering commitment towards maintaining the highest standards of quality eve care and patient safety. To ensure we have the right set of Quality indicators to monitor our performance and identify areas that need improvement, all the 56 Quality indicators have been reviewed. To ensure staff is having the right set of guidelines to refer to and appropriate care is being provided to all patients, all the SOPs were reviewed. Periodic evaluation of clinical care is crucial to ensure variations from standards, if any, are highlighted and rectified. Towards this, 2 cycles of Medical audits have been conducted across units by a Team of consultants. Committees at SEFI have always been on the forefront towards coordinating and monitoring hospital-wide activities that are critical in the delivery of quality health care services. As per the Annual calender shared with units, committees like Quality committee, Safety committee, Infection control committee, Pharmacy committee, etc. have been regularly conducted and have been very efficient in ensuring implementation of various improvement initiatives.

Building Excellence Together

Towards our continual efforts of improving patient safety and quality of care across all units, 8th **SanQALP** workshop has been successfully conducted on 16th – 17th Sep'22. This year in the background of uncertainty from the pandemic, we looked at High reliability as the core. Quality champions across units and 3 external experts were a part of this workshop.


Ensuring Standardized Care Through Accreditations And Certifications



Opinion

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND OTHER NOTES – FY 2022-23 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared under historical cost convention and on mercantile basis and in accordance with applicable accounting standards laid down by the Institute of chartered Accountants of India and normally accepted accounting principles. The accounting is on the basic of a going concern concept.

2. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost of acquisition, including attributable cost for bringing the assets to its working condition for its intended use.

Fixed assets received as contributions in kind are stated at the cost incurred by its donor and other expenses to its working condition for its intended use.

Depreciation is calculated using the straight–line method over the estimated useful lives of the fixed assets as determined by the management. The loss or profit on disposal of asset is recognized in the year when the asset(s) is disposed off or the asset is condemned.

3. Investments

Investments are in the form of fixed deposits with Scheduled banks.

4. Inventories

Inventories consist of Medicines, surgical items, lens, optical, etc., Valued at cost.

5. Liabilities

Liabilities acknowledged as debt are taken into account, while contingent and disputed liabilities if any, are not provided for and are disclosed by way of a note.

6. Provisions

Provision is recognized when an enterprise has a present obligation as a result of past event and is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are determined based on management estimates required to settle the obligations at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each Balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current management estimate.

7. Revenue Recognition

Hospital service income, reflected is at gross amount as reduced by rebates/discounts and other concessions granted.

Income due to the hospital by way of reimbursement from District Blindness Society of the respective States is accounted on actual receipt basis.

8. Foreign Currency Transaction

Foreign currency transaction are recorded at the rates prevailing on the date of transaction.

9. Research and development

Capital expenditure, if any, on research and development is treated in the same way as expenditure on fixed assets. The Revenue expenditure if any, on Research and Development is written off in a year in which it is incurred.

10. Retirement Benefits

a) Retirement benefits such as periodical contribution to provident and Employees state insurance being defined contribution plans are charged to revenue on payment that had become due.

b) The Employee's gratuity is a defined benefit plan. The present value of the obligation under such plan is determined based on the actuarial valuation using the projected unit credit method which recognizes each period of service as giving rise to an additional unit of employee benefit entitlement and measures each unit separately to build up the financial obligation. The trust has an employee gratuity fund managed by trustees through Life Insurance Corporation of India.

c) Liability towards gratuity is provided and contributed to the trustees of the approved fund on the basis of actuarial valuation made and reported by actuaries of the Life Insurance Corporation of India as at the end of the year.

11. Leave benefits

Leave benefits earned by the eligible employees being accounted as and when it is paid to the employees.

12. Contingent liabilities

There are no contingent liabilities pending as 31/03/2023 in account of
(a) Legal cases
(b) Pending taxes or any other statutory liability
(c) LC discounted, except bank Guarantees provided for Rs.18.25 lacs for various Hospital operations.

13. Secured loans

Loan Payable on demand of Rs 24.18 Lakhs from Canara bank is secured by mortgage of Immovable properties situated at 16A, Sankara Eye Hospital St, Sathy Road, Coimbatore.
